ANOTHER MOTHER FOR PEACE REVITALIZED AMID PUBLIC OUTCRY AGAINST WAR

- World-recognized peace organization from the sixties is reincorporated by a group including founding members and their children -

Los Angeles, October 26, 2003 - Another Mother for Peace celebrated its March 2003 re-incorporation as a California non-profit at a kick-off event in Brentwood today. Nearly twenty years after the last newsletter was distributed, the organization, which was originally formed to protest the war in Vietnam, was reestablished following a groundswell of support and urging from former members and the public at large. The group's logo, the Sunflower design and the words, "War is not healthy for children and other living things", created by the artist Lorraine Schneider in 1966, continues to resonate across generations and embody the anti-war sentiments of many people around the world.

Created in a Los Angeles living room in 1967 by sixteen women with no previous peace activism experience, Another Mother for Peace grew to become one of the most visible and vocal opponents of the war in Vietnam. At its height, AMP had 400,000 subscribers to its newsletter and orchestrated numerous mail-in campaigns that flooded the offices of legislators on Capitol Hill. Another Mother for Peace galvanized opposition to war in America's heartland, attracting supporters from across the political spectrum.

Another Mother for Peace's main purpose, to encourage the active and informed participation of citizens in our democracy, is based upon the belief that speaking one's conscience is the patriotic duty of every citizen. The organization publishes "Peace Materials" and conducts peace advocacy campaigns using a variety of media in order to achieve that goal.

Following today's event, Another Mother for Peace will be initiating its next "Peace Homework" assignment. By distributing hundreds of "Peace Packets" containing postcards the group plans to spread the word about AMP's rebirth and urge members of Congress to "Make Peace a Priority!"
